**FROM THE CHAPLAIN'S DESK**

***The Holy Week, the Triduum and the Season of Easter***

We celebrate on Sunday, April 2nd Palm Sunday, the beginning of the Holy Week. It is an important time in the life of the Catholic Church. Also known as Passion Sunday, Palm Sunday is the sixth and last Sunday of Lent. We mark on this day the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem near the end of his public ministry.

The crowds who were in Jerusalem for Passover, waved and laid palm branches on the road and proclaimed Jesus as the Messianic King, the long-awaited Messiah. They shouted, "Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord." Their celebrating didn't last long. They turned against Him within days. The adoring crowds shouted later "Crucify Him!"

Lent exists as a preparation for something bigger, The **Triduum**: the three-day celebration of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Christ - Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Vigil/Easter Sunday. The Church meets at times during these three days to remember what it is that Jesus has done for us.

The term Triduum means "three days." The three days are counted as the Hebrews counted their days, from dusk to dusk. Therefore, the three days of the Easter Triduum are from dusk on Holy Thursday to dusk on Good Friday (day one), dusk on Good Friday to dusk on Holy Saturday (day two), and dusk on Holy Saturday to dusk on Easter Sunday (day three).

Each of these days "tells" a different part of the story of Jesus' saving action. (*Also, there are practices unique during the Triduum that we only see them during this time of the year.*)

- On Holy Thursday we remember the Last Supper. Jesus gives us the Eucharist and tells us to "Do this in memory of me." He then washes the feet of the apostles. (*The washing of the feet*). It is also a celebration of the Ministerial Priesthood. We include in our prayers all our Priests who minister to us.
- On Good Friday we remember the passion and death of Jesus. (*The veneration of the cross*). It is a Day of Fasting and Abstinence.
- We celebrate the resurrection of Christ either at the Easter Vigil on Saturday night when new members are baptized and welcomed into our Catholic community (*The service of light, the singing of the Exultet, the baptism of the elect, and the reception of the candidates into full membership in the Catholic Church*) or on Easter Sunday.

At various times during these three days, we are called to church to gather and remember together. We are also requested to keep the spirit of these days even in our homes, if possible. We try to live a quieter, simpler life focusing more our attention on Christ and less on the secular world. It is said that the whole Triduum experience can touch our inner being and move our soul.

The Triduum reaches its highlight on the Easter Vigil, when, after the Easter proclamation we greet each other with great joy "Happy Easter!" Indeed, "Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!" This ancient greeting sums up what we celebrate on Easter, the joy of Christ risen and alive in our midst. This then is the Joyful Good News: Christ



by his death and resurrection has conquered sin so we may live. The Lord's Resurrection is the foundation and cornerstone of our faith. As St. Paul says if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is useless, and our faith too is in vain (Cf. 1 Cor 15:14).

On Easter Vigil we recall God's story – in our story of salvation. The liturgy of the Word re-enacts that story and we joyfully celebrate the risen Lord in our midst as He offers Himself anew in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We do this in a spirit of thanksgiving to God who gives His own Son to die in order to rescue us from the slavery of sin. May we live as people deeply touched by the resurrection and proclaim: Christ is risen, Alleluia! May our encounter with the risen Lord on our journey of faith touch us deeply and transform us as He did for His Disciples. May the resurrection lead us to be the best version of ourselves; committed to live out our Baptismal covenant.

When we live the new life of the resurrection, we become the best version of ourselves. We become what Saint Augustine referred to as an "Easter People", a people transformed into disciples and stewards who commit to give their time, talent and treasure in witness. My prayer for you on Easter is that you live as people deeply touched by the resurrection and proclaim: Christ is risen, Alleluia, Alleluia!

## CULTURE OF LIFE NEWS

### Look We Must



It was like a ritual. On Saturday night, the family would gather around the television, but not to watch a sitcom, Western, or a detective show. It was to watch NBC's Saturday Night at the Movies. Premiering in the fall of 1961, it was the first show to broadcast in living color relatively recent offerings from major movie studios. It was usually fun watching.

Over the years, the show's popularity diminished. Competition from other national networks took its toll. Perhaps the biggest hit came from a new media source—cable television. It offered feature movies without commercials—at least that was the pitch. Today we don't need cable channels. We can stream movies from a variety of providers.

Whatever the source, movies will always be big, and watching them at home is still a ritual. Yet with all the available choices, it can be difficult to find a worthwhile one. So many movies are so very dark. Death is a prominent theme. Murder is a recurring sight. Serial killing, even ritualistic killing, has become a ghastly form of entertainment. And on film, Satan has become a familiar figure.

We seem to have lost the reality of Satan and hell. We treat them as psychological constructs created for people not as sophisticated as us. We don't hear much about Satan in Sunday homilies. Schools don't talk much about Satan. But Jesus did, and if anyone could distinguish truth from a psychological construct, it was Jesus. He had firsthand experience. In His divinity, He saw the fall of Satan from Heaven. Jesus had no reason to deceive us, and no reason to sugarcoat Satan's evil. So, our place in eternity may well depend on our ability to recognize Satan's prowl.

Our de-emphasis of Satan as the master of evil has been good news for him, for it has allowed him to move freely in hearts and minds. And Satan has done just that.

Satan's victims are not only the depraved of the world, those people whose hearts have turned to pure evil. They are everyday people who have fallen for Satan's lies. Today Satan roams the culture so freely that he boasts an earthly organization—The Satanic Temple—based in Salem, Massachusetts. The temple claims a membership of to 700,000 worldwide, with thousands in the U.S. And unfortunately, the temple is hard at work.

What is the temple all about? According to its website, the temple's mission is "to encourage benevolence and empathy, reject tyrannical authority, advocate practical common sense, oppose injustice, and undertake noble pursuits." Has a nice ring to it, something any civic organization would be proud to support. But its chant is "Hail Satan," a sound eerily like the "Heil (Hail) Hitler" allegiance behind the barbarianism of the 20th century. And like Hitler did, the Satanic temple is much about converting our young to Satan's ways. The temple features a statue of a goat-like winged figure, seated on a throne with an arm raised in the manner of a resurrected Jesus. Standing on either side of the figure are two children gazing adoringly at the hideous creature. The image is hard to look at. But look we must.

Throughout human history Satan has been known as the Great Deceiver. So, we must compare the temple's tenets with its actions. It proclaims that personal beliefs should conform to "one's best scientific understanding of the world" and never "distort scientific facts to fit one's beliefs." That tenet should provide support for the unborn, whose humanity at conception has been proven time and again. But not so. The temple has now opened its own abortion mill in New Mexico. It's called the Samuel Alito's Mom's Satanic Abortion Clinic—a death wish to the SCOTUS justice who wrote the opinion overruling *Roe v. Wade*. The mill offers abortion drugs to women 17 and older who are up to 11 weeks pregnant. The temple treats abortion as a religious ritual akin to being baptized or receiving Communion.

Satan's grip on our culture should disturb, alarm, and even frighten us. But by no stretch of the imagination should it surprise us. We should have seen it coming. Abortion has been touted as the great equalizer for women, who through killing their children can be set "free." The empty promise sounds so reminiscent of Satan's tempting of Adam and Eve—you can be like God. As did Adam and Eve, we fell for the lie. Abortion hurts, not helps, women. It can burden them physically, emotionally, even physically for the rest of their lives.

We all fall for Satan's lies. It's part of human nature weakened by original sin. The more serious problem is that our culture has accepted Satan's lie as gospel truth. For over 50 years it has extolled killing as freeing, health-providing, and even loving. The abortion industry profits off death. Politicians from the president on down gain power off it. With help like that, Satan no longer needs to work in disguise. Satan is advertising—and people are buying.

And make no mistake about Satan's targets. Take another look at those children and their gaze. Do they look like they can fall for the lie? Do we want them to live a life of hell, followed by an eternity in it? In our churches, homes, and schools, we must creatively, appropriately teach the truth. We must end the reign of abortion profiteers. And must vote out politicians who allow Satan to prowl the country seeking the ruin of souls. Our eternity may depend on it.

## FRATERNAL INSURANCE AGENT'S CORNER



Easter greetings! As we roll through the first full month of spring we celebrate Easter with thoughts of gratitude for the gift of new life. The Resurrection and thoughts of our Savior's sacrifice and triumph over death are fresh in our minds and hearts. The dreariness of winter and Lent fade away with April rains that seem to have their own scent. All nature seems in bloom.

Trees barren not long ago are now budding and flowers begin to poke through the warming soil. For many, it's their favorite season of the year.

Along with everything else going on in April, it is also Autism Awareness month. The Autism Speaks website ([www.autismspeaks.org](http://www.autismspeaks.org)) contains much more information that I can give you here. Autism has been more widely discussed and better understood in recent years. Although the TV show "The Good Doctor" portrays a doctor who has autism, those with Autism Spectrum Disorder exhibit a broad range of characteristics. Many have much less functionality than the doctor portrayed on the show. I mention this because many of us know of someone who is on this autism spectrum. If diagnosed early in childhood and intervention begun, those with autism may still live a relatively normal life. However, many with autism struggle and have other complicating medical or psychological issues and need much support during their lives.

That's where the Knights of Columbus Family Fraternal Benefits may be able to help. The Family Fraternal Benefits cover a number of situations. One benefit addresses the child who is older than 60 days and younger than 18 and is uninsurable according to our ordinary underwriting practices. Many children with autism as a primary or secondary diagnosis fall into this category uninsurable. For those children, the Order has a special family fraternal benefit that allows the issuing of an ordinary permanent life insurance policy on this uninsurable child. Some members may be unaware of this benefit, but it's great news for any parent with a child who does not qualify for life insurance. There are some other qualifiers for the parents and any other children in the family, including that the father must be a member in good standing in his council. I won't go into the others here, but this is a very worthwhile benefit, not only for those children with autism, but for any child who may be uninsurable.

If you know of a Catholic family that may have a child with autism or any family with a child who is uninsurable, please reach out to me. They may be unaware of this benefit. I will be happy to contact them explain this valuable protection that is available. If you prefer, give my name and contact information to that parent so they

can contact me at their convenience. As always, there is never any requirement to purchase any product, but a consultation about this benefit may bring them some small comfort.
