FROM THE CHAPLAIN'S DESK

Rest and Leisure during Summer



With Memorial Day several weeks back, we marked the unofficial start of the summer season. Graduation or Commencement Exercises have been held. Our children are off from school. A little over two years ago, leisure travel had become almost impossible due to the Covid-19 pandemic and the strict quarantine protocols. With the availability of vaccines and booster shots, many travel plans are made despite high airfare and gas prices. Our airports are becoming busy almost back to pre-pandemic levels and most airlines are back to profitability.

As we carry out our duties and generously go about our professional work, it is natural that fatigue appears as an almost inseparable companion, especially at this time of the year when the weather starts to get very warm. We should not be surprised if we sometimes get tired more easily and need rest. Far from complaining about this inescapable reality, we have to learn to rest close to God. No one understands our tiredness better than the Lord. In our free time, we need to recuperate our energies if we are to serve better and also avoid injuring our health.

In the Gospel, Jesus says to his disciples, "Come away by yourselves for a while, and rest a little" (Mark 6:30). On another occasion, Jesus says, "Come to me, all you who labor and find life burdensome, and I will give you rest" (Mt. 11:28). We make our burden lighter when we unite our tiredness to that of Christ. Tiredness teaches us to be humble and to live charity better. We discover at times like these that we cannot do everything and that we need other people. When we are tired, we discover that it is more difficult to do things well the way God wants us to do them. For this reason we need to learn to rest.

Our life is an immensely beneficial gift from God. We have to live the years that God wants and go on to complete the task that He has entrusted to us. As a consequence, for God's sake and for the sake of other people, we need to be prudent in caring for our own health and that of the people who in any way depend on us. Subjecting oneself to a timetable, dedicating sufficient time to sleep, doing some exercise and eating the right amount and kind of food is very important. In short, we need to put order into our life and activity. Above all, we need to learn to rest. If we can avoid becoming totally exhausted, we should not fail to do so. We need to rest in order to be fit, to restore lost energy, and so that our work may be more effective. Above all we need to rest so as to serve God and other people better.

We need not forget that the use of leisure is an activity we must sanctify. Holiday time isn't meant to be a time for doing nothing. Rest means recuperation – to gain strength, to form ideals and make plans, it means a change of occupation so that we can come back later to our daily job with a renewed energy. Nowadays, one gets the impression that many people leave their supernatural life totally to one side when planning to go for their holidays: they often choose resorts which are so paganized that no good-living Christian should be seen there. It would be silly of someone who normally tries to live in the presence of God, to tacitly endorse that sort of environment by holidaying there, not to mention the danger of leaving

themselves open to offending God grievously. Leisure and vacation time should facilitate and not obstruct our encounter with Christ. Far from letting ourselves be influenced by what is considered fashionable, we need to be attentive and careful in choosing a suitable place for our holidays; how best to plan a journey; how most profitably to arrange a weekend activity away from work. We need to be good stewards of our life and our time if we desire to become good disciples of the Lord.

In living out Stewardship as a Way of Life, let not our financial support to our Parish and Church take a break while we go on a break. Perhaps, we need to make a definite plan on how to go about in our weekly stewardship offerings to our Church. May the Lord who can never be outdone in love and generosity reward you a hundredfold. May you all have a safe and restful summer.

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly's statement on the U.S. Supreme Court decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization

After nearly 50 years, the wrong decision that was made in Roe v. Wade has been set right. The Supreme Court's historic decision in Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization overturning both Roe and Planned Parenthood v. Casey, is a watershed moment in the movement that generations of Knights of Columbus have worked and prayed for. Indeed, it is one of the most significant advancements in human rights in our nation's history.

We are grateful and encouraged by the Court's finding that abortion is not a "constitutional right." But we must not think that today is a day to declare victory. Instead, I call upon every member of the Knights of Columbus to redouble their personal efforts to build up the Culture of Life that St. John Paul II described in his prophetic encyclical letter Evangelium Vitae.

With Roe reversed, federal advocacy to protect unborn life is still necessary, but the decision opens wide the doors for states to consider their own abortion laws

Let us find our response in the words Pope Francis addressed to the 2021 Supreme Convention, which called on us to be men "committed to building up rather than tearing down, promoting healing and reconciliation in place of hatred and recrimination, and inviting all to undertake the 'journey of fraternity' that can lead to a world ever more in accord with God's saving plan for our human family."

Finally, we must continue to pray and fast for the end of abortion. How fitting it is that the Dobbs decision arrived on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Let us pray in thanksgiving for this decision, and continue to implore the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe as we work to build a Culture of Life in which every human life, made in the image and likeness of God, is welcomed in life and protected in law.
