FROM THE CHAPLAIN'S DESK

Pilgrims of Hope: The Jubilee Year 2025



In 2025, the Catholic Church will celebrate the Jubilee Year, a sacred tradition observed every 25 years, with the motto "Pilgrims of Hope." Announced by Pope Francis, this Holy Year is an invitation for the faithful to embark on a journey of spiritual renewal, reflection, and community.

A Jubilee Year, also known as a Holy Year, is one of the great events of the Catholic Church. Celebrated every 25 years, this observance calls pilgrims

to Rome and Catholics everywhere to focus on the beauties of the faith, to strengthen our relationship with the risen Lord and to practice more intently the virtues that make us Catholic Christians.

The last Jubilee Year, celebrated in the year 2000, marked the beginning of a new millennium with a focus on forgiveness, reconciliation, and unity. As we approach 2025, Pope Francis calls upon Catholics worldwide to embrace the spirit of hope, encouraging believers to look forward with optimism and faith in God's providence.

The Jubilee Year is a time for us Catholics to engage in pilgrimage, prayer, and acts of charity. Pilgrims from around the globe will be welcomed in Rome, where special events, liturgies, and opportunities for confession will be held. The Holy Doors of the major basilicas in Rome will be opened, symbolizing the pathway to salvation and the mercy of God.

The Jubilee Year of Hope takes on special meaning as the world continues to recover from the recent suffocating COVID-19 epidemic. No one was immune from the COVID-19 crisis. Churches, schools and businesses were shut down, thousands succumbed to the illness and many, because of quarantine restrictions, died alone. It was a surreal time; we became like sheep wandering without a shepherd. In centuries past, when a plague ravished the land, people flocked to the Church, to the promise and confidence of the Blessed Sacrament and our holy oasis. But on this occasion, the Church was locked.

The impact of the coronavirus on our lives, especially on the young, was devastating. Faith and hope were shattered. During this jubilee year, the pope is summoning the faithful to Rome to rekindle faith, to renew in us God's gift of hope: "And hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the holy Spirit" (Rom 5:5). In the face of global challenges and personal struggles, the Pope reminds us that hope is a powerful force that sustains and guides us. He also emphasizes the importance of community, urging the faithful to support one another, extend compassion, and work towards a more just and loving world.

As we prepare for the 2025 Jubilee Year, let us reflect on our own journeys of faith, rekindle our hope, and commit to living out the Gospel message in our daily lives. This Holy Year offers a unique opportunity to deepen our relationship with God and with each other, united as pilgrims of hope.

Preparing for the Jubilee Year 2025 of Hope is a good prelude to the Year of Redemption happening in 2033. It will be a momentous occasion marking the 2,000th anniversary of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. The Year of Redemption 2033 is a milestone,

a time of profound spiritual opportunity for us Catholic Christians to reflect deeply on the core events and central mysteries of their faith, renew our commitment to Christ, and celebrate the incredible gift of salvation. May the Jubilee Year of Hope 2025 and the Holy Year of Redemption 2025 be a time of grace, renewal, and transformation for individuals and communities around the world.

CULTURE OF LIFE NEWS

On 55th Anniversary, Humanae Vitae (Of Human Life) Is more Relevant than Ever

In the wake of the Supreme Court's Dobbs vs. Jackson decision just one year ago, many Catholics are being forced to revisit what it means to be truly pro-life. As the question of the legality of abortion is being considered by each state, a sad truth has been revealed. While most pro-life people seem to admit that a baby about six months or later in utero is a child, the earlier in the pregnancy one goes, the more questionable the life of the child becomes to many people. Once we get to the earliest stages of pregnancy at 4-5 weeks, things become very muddled for both Catholics and non-Catholics alike—hence the strange response to many of the pro-life laws, despite polls in which people overwhelmingly respond that they are pro-life.

While we can argue over the details of each law, allowing different circumstances and exceptions, ultimately, the debate boils down to one question: when does life begin?

As Catholics, we are told that life begins at conception—it is for this reason that the Church stands against abortion in all circumstances, and also against all forms of contraception. This teaching has been articulated in many places throughout the Church's rich history, but has been especially considered in recent times, with the advent of modern forms of contraception. Our Church is one that is truly pro-life. At our core is a belief that human life, created in the image of the wonderful Creator, is good, no matter the difficulties or circumstances of its coming into being.

This teaching can be hard for many to grasp—both

inside and outside the Church. It leads to all kinds of questions regarding how we treat women, how we act as married couples, and how we can respond to a crisis pregnancy. It should also inform how we vote and interact with our elected officials. We cannot separate this teaching from living our Catholic faith, or even compromise on it, as it lies at the heart of the understanding of the human person. However, it also does not stand alone, but rather these questions need to be addressed in the context of the whole of faith—hand in hand with understanding the virtue of Chastity, the beauty of true Charity, and the light of forgiveness.

It should be clear to all who live today that this is not a simple issue for many people—and neither does the Church see it as entirely simple. For this reason, recent popes have spent ample time teaching both the reasons why the Church believes this and how we can respond to human life and sexuality in a way that is beneficial for both women and children.

It is now more important than ever that Catholics turn to the Church for guidance to help them understand these complex issues. Fortunately, the Church does not disappoint. This month marks the 55th anniversary of one of the most concise but also profound modern encyclicals on the subject: *Humanae Vitae*. In this letter, Pope Paul VI provides an incredible resource for Catholics looking to better understand why the Catholic Church stands against contraception and abortion. In articulating the Church's position, he guides his flock to see how using contraception—and the mentality that leads to its use—has led to a whole gamut of cultural problems, including the increase in divorce and the scourge of abortion.

This document is worthy of a close study, rather than just a passing read through. It's worth discussing with friends, fellow parishioners, or anyone interested in knowing more about why the Church holds its positions. It's worth considering both for what it means to our culture and for what it means in your own life.

Though the organization Endow writes their studies for women, its study on *Humanae Vitae* is uniquely put together such that co-ed (or even male) groups can benefit from working through its pages. Giving its readers the historical and societal context for the document, this invaluable study helps its participants to consider and discuss the reasons for the Church's teaching and to consider how this teaching can be applied to their own lives. In doing so, Endow's study provides the ready preparation its participants need to engage with the culture, helping to spread the culture of life.
