FROM THE CHAPLAIN'S DESK

October is Respect Life Month



October 2, the first Sunday of October is Respect Life Sunday. It also marks the beginning of the Respect Life Month, a time to consider more deeply why every human life is valuable and reflect on how to build a culture that protects and cherishes every human life from the moment of conception to its natural death.

Although we are devoted to protecting and nurturing life at every stage all year long, the month of October is set aside as a special time to acknowledge the sanctity of all human life and to recommit ourselves to engaging in prayer and activity that promotes the dignity of the human person. Sponsored by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), our Bishops make this very important appeal that we may offer this world of ours new signs of hope and work to ensure that justice and solidarity will increase and that a new culture of human life will be affirmed for the building of authentic civilization of truth and love. According to the Respect for Life Principle all living things have a moral status and on account of that should not be killed or harmed without good reason.

This year, our belief that every human life should be protected and cherished from conception has been under attack. Elected officials continue their efforts to force taxpayer-funded abortion. Two persons enter an abortion clinic. Only one comes out. Abortion is not life-sustaining. Take for example Proposition 1, a worst case for abortion in California.

Proposition 1 is an expansive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions – for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars. Proposition 1 is not needed. Sadly, California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation that would remain in effect without the amendment, including our current limit on late-term abortions that are permitted only for the life and health of the mother. Proposition 1 destroys all limits.

Our extremely Pro-Abortion Democrat Governor Gavin Newsom has declared California an “Abortion Sanctuary” inviting women from all over the country to come to California for their abortion. Our extremely Pro-Abortion Democrat-controlled Legislature is also promoting Proposition 1. California does not limit state spending on abortion, and with thousands more traveling from other states, the cost will be in the hundreds of millions. Don't hand lawmakers a blank check to pay for abortions, and don't let them make California an “abortion sanctuary.” This November, Vote “NO” on Proposition 1.

As we enter Respect Life Month, the bishops of California are inviting all Catholics to engage in prayer and fasting to end abortion and for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit to form the minds and hearts of California citizens to defeat Prop 1. With that in mind, our bishops are hosting a Novena to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary to Defeat Proposition 1 from

September 29 to October 7. Please visit www.Catholic.org/Prop1 for the daily video messages. At the same time, please join our interfaith friends of 40 Days for Life from September 28 to November 6 for their annual campaign to end abortion: www.40daysforlife.com.

I am very pleased that the Knights of Columbus has always supported all Pro-Life efforts and activities as they always upheld the inviolability of life from the moment of its conception to its natural death. May the Lord bless the Knights of Columbus!

Letter from Bishop Oscar Cantú on California Proposition 1

August 26, 2022

Brothers and Sisters in Christ, As we continue our journey as a local Church here in our Diocese of San Jose, we are working to increase support for pregnant and parenting women, their children, and families and protect the sanctity of every human life at every stage. The state legislature passed a bill, which Governor Newsom has signed, which will be placed before voters on November 8th (or sooner, for mail-in ballots and early voting). Proposition 1 is both egregious and dangerous for two simple reasons: the bill's broad language enshrines a right to late-term abortions (which most Californians agree should be limited) in the state constitution; and it will use taxpayer funds to administer them.

The California Catholic Conference has joined a broad coalition of Californians to defeat Prop 1. Defeating Prop 1 will allow the present California abortion laws to stand, which are already among the most permissive in the country. Most Californians prefer the status quo in California rather than the extreme law that Prop 1 would enshrine.

I, therefore, call on all Catholics throughout the diocese to unite in prayer and action to defeat Prop 1. Please visit www.CAcatholic.org/Prop1 to find answers to common questions and resources to help defeat this misleading, expensive, and unnecessary ballot initiative.

I invite all Catholics in the Diocese of San José to support this effort with prayers, fasting, financial contributions, sharing resources with friends and family, reaching out to your designated Parish Leads, and any other means possible. My brother bishops and I will be journeying with you in this effort as we take the prayerful lead in a novena for the defeat of Prop 1, beginning on September 29 and ending on October 7th.
